



NASCAR fans can take shuttles from Indy airport to 2010 Brickyard 400 on July 25

INDIANAPOLIS—Race fans who want to take advantage of quick, convenient, and affordable transportation to the Indianapolis Motor Speedway for the Brickyard 400 need are invited to park at Indianapolis International Airport (IND) and take a comfortable, air-conditioned shuttle to the track.

Sit back, relax, and let professionals do the driving—catch one of the continuously shuttles between the airport and the speedway on race day!

The Free Enterprise System is providing the service. Cost for the shuttles is \$22 per person for a round-trip ticket.

- Race day parking at the airport for those who want to take the Brickyard 400 shuttle will be on the top (Level 5) floor of the parking garage. Cost is \$10.
- **Fans must present their 2010 Brickyard 400 ticket stub from the race to the cashier upon exit to receive the \$10 rate. Without the race ticket stub, drivers will be charged the regular \$18 daily rate for parking in the garage.**
- Once parked, fans should take elevators or stairs to the first floor of the parking garage and proceed to the Ground Transportation Center (GTC) lobby. Tickets can be purchased at the Star of America booth.
- Shuttles will pick-up and drop-off passengers in Zone 1, just outside the GTC lobby. They will leave from the airport starting at 8 a.m. until 1 p.m.
- After the race, fans should go to the shuttle staging area at the corner of Main & Gilman Streets near the track. Fans should take the “Blue Route” shuttles back to the airport.
- Shuttle service will continue for three (3) hours after the conclusion of the race.
