



Airport authority to hold September open houses for public about land use study

INDIANAPOLIS—Local residents, homeowners, business owners, and others interested in the Indianapolis Airport Authority (IAA) 2010 LandINSight Initiative are invited to attend one of three free open houses to be held September 28, 29, and 30 from 6:30 to 8 p.m.

Each of the sessions will be held in a different location, including Indianapolis, Fishers, and Greenfield. Key consultants and experts associated with this comprehensive land use and development study will be on hand to answer questions and provide additional information. Attendees may come and go as their schedules allow.

Maps of airport properties will be arranged in individual stations, where project personnel will be on hand for discussion and dialogue. Attendees can move among the stations at their own pace according to their own interests.

“At this point in the study, we are developing detailed maps for each of our facilities that are reflective of the research and data compiled to date. They also illustrate—to the best of our current knowledge—the future directions we believe will be needed to ensure the smart growth and planned development of our entire airport system,” explains Mark Hedegard, senior director of business development for IAA.

Hedegard notes attendees can view maps of land that is likely to be designated for planned aviation use, non-aviation use, conservation and wildlife protection, and future aviation expansion.

IAA's LandINSight Initiative will result in a long-term master plan guiding future growth and development of all IAA properties, which include Indianapolis International Airport as well as its general aviation facilities, which include Mt Comfort Airport, Metropolitan Airport, Indianapolis Downtown Heliport, Eagle Creek Airpark, and Hendricks County Airport-Gordon Graham Field.

While the outcome of the initiative is intended to explore innovative ways for maximizing IAA's potential to generate both aviation and nonaviation revenue, it is also expected to make a positive contribution to employment and economic development throughout central Indiana.
