AMBASSADOR RANDALL L. TOBIAS served as vice chair of AT&T from 1986–93; chair and CEO of AT&T Communications from 1986–91; and chair and CEO of AT&T International from 1991–93. Tobias joined Eli Lilly & Company as chair, president, and CEO in 1993. Under his leadership, the company enjoyed one of the most successful periods in its history. In 2003, Tobias was appointed U.S. Global AIDS coordinator with the rank of ambassador. He was responsible for launching and leading the President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR), and directing all international HIV/AIDS assistance across various federal agencies and departments. In 2006 he became the first director of United States Foreign Assistance with the rank of deputy secretary of state, concurrently serving as administrator of the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID). He returned to private life in 2007 and served as president of the Indianapolis Airport Authority from January 2008 through mid-2009.
